# THE CAMP EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME...

One Heartland's mission is to improve the lives of children, youth, and families facing significant health challenges or social isolation. To do this, we welcome youth who are:

- ↑ living with or affected by HIV/AIDS
- † experiencing homelessness
- ↑ in the LGBTQ+ community
- **†** working towards a healthier lifestyle

All our participants are 7-20 years old. About 75% are living at or below federal poverty level. Around 70% are youth of color. Over 60% of our campers are Minnesota natives, with most of those coming from the Twin Cities metro area. The rest travel from other states to attend.




**Camp Heartland**, our flagship program, began in 1993 to give youth living with HIV the summer adventure of a lifetime. **Camp Hollywood HEART** began shortly thereafter in California, as an arts-based camp for older youth. Both of these programs still exist today and continue to adapt to the changing landscape of HIV/AIDS.

**Camp Northstar** is a respite for children experiencing homelessness or housing instability. We added a second session in 2017 and now welcome about 120 youth annually.

**Camp True Colors** for LGBTQ+ youth is our fastest growing program. We added a second session in 2018 and a third session in 2019 with 160 expected to attend each year from now on.

**Camp 5210** helps youth on their journey towards a healthier lifestyle. This program welcomes about 80 youth each year.
